Who was involved in putting the Bond package together?

The plan was developed with extensive community input from a diverse group of citizens from all parts of the district.

A committee of more than 50 community and business leaders began work in April 2014 to evaluate the facilities of the district. During the course of their meetings, they studied facilities needs and deficiencies, student enrollment, demographics reports and financial reports before making a final recommendation to the Board of Trustees.


